Conditions:

All Exhibits must be baked prior to day of judging.

All exhibits must have entry tickets attached and be delivered to the Homecraft Pavilion at the Wannon Rooms 8:30am-12noon on Friday, 24th October. After judging, no exhibit or part thereof may be altered or removed.

To be collected between 9am-12 noon on Sunday, 26th October when all exhibits must be collected. Cookery entries to be presented on an appropriately sized white paper plate with entry ticket stapled to plate.

Chief Steward reserves the right to change plates if considered necessary for proper presentation. Entries not presented as specified will not be judged.

VAS JUNIOR EVENTS

Class 5303 VAS Junior Carrot & Sultana Muffins Competition

Open to junior bakers under 18 years on the day of their Local Show

- 2½ cups Self-Raising flour
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg
- 1 cup brown sugar (firmly packed)
- 1/3 cup chopped in half sultanas
- 1 cup coarsely grated carrot

Method:

1. Pre-heat oven to 190C (moderately hot).
2. Line a 12-hole muffin pan with round paper muffin cases - Classic white muffin cases size (35mm Height x 80mm Wide x 50mm Base).
3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl, stir in sultanas and carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
4. Spoon mixture evenly into muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked insert cake skewer, if it comes out clean the muffins are ready.

- 375 g (12 oz) mixed fruit
- ¾ cup brown sugar
- 1 teaspoon mixed spice
- ½ cup water
- 125 g (4 oz) butter
- ½ teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
- ½ cup sherry
- 2 eggs lightly beaten
- 2 tablespoons marmalade
- 1 cup self-raising flour

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The entrant must follow the recipe and specifications provided below.

Ingredients:

- 1 tablespoon orange marmalade
 - 1 cup canola oil
 - 2 eggs, lightly beaten
 - ¾ cup orange juice
 - 1 cup reduced fat milk
6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.
 7. Show Entries: Four (4) muffins per paper plate.

Class 5304 VAS Junior Boiled Fruit Cake Competition

Open to junior bakers under 18 years on the day of their Local Show

The entrant must follow the recipe and specifications provided below.

The entrant must be under 18 years on the day of their local show.

Ingredients:

- 1 cup plain flour
- ¼ teaspoon salt

Method:

1. Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil.
2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove from stove, add bicarbonate soda and allow to cool. Add the

sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well.

3. Fold in the sifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.
4. Bake in a moderately slow oven for 1.5 hours or until cooked when tested.
